

Year 1 – The Victorians

ENGLISH:

Fiction - Emotive story writing, descriptive language and correct punctuation.

Non-fiction - Create chronological reports, Write clear instructions and captions.

SPaG - Capital letters, full stops, finger spaces.

KEY TEXTS - You would not want to be a Victorian Child, Queen Victoria's Bathing Machine, Oliver Twist, The Queen's Knickers.

HISTORY

Looking at inventions through the ages and comparing transport and toys from Victorian to modern day. Looking at the life's of Queen Victoria, The Wright Brothers and Florence Nightingale. Learning about significant historical events, including Remembrance Day.

SCIENCE

Describe what different materials feel and look like and compare and group them. Decide on the purpose of an object and why a materials properties make it suitable.

MATHS

Shape - recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes. Add and subtract one digit numbers to 10, including zero. Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction.

Place Value - count to 20, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, from any given number.

Count, read and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words.

KEY SKILLS TO BE DEVELOPED:

To develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time.

To ask and answer questions, and understand how over time things evolve and we are part of that evolution.
