Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been great to welcome all of the children back into the classroom following these unusual times. We would like to take the opportunity to say how well the class has adapted to the changes and new routines that have been put in place.

The class has joined the rest of the school by following a project around the book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers which was an ideal start for the children to express their feelings following their different times in lockdown. P.E.:

We would kindly ask that your child has the correct P.E. kit and trainers in school, for playing on the grass in all weather conditions. Spare socks are a great addition to P.E. kits. Children will be asked to wear shorts in games lessons up until half term and therefore the appropriate blue school shorts should be worn. During the colder months, children are allowed to wear tracksuits for outdoor P.E. lessons. Children who are missing P.E. kit will not be permitted to take part. P.E. is a requirement of the National Curriculum and therefore non-participation is taken very seriously.
